#### Women's Fellowship 130th Anniversary Celebration

One Hundred and Thirty Years Strong! In 1890, the corrugated cardboard box was invented, Dwight Eisenhower was born, and Wyoming, the only territory at the time that allowed women to vote, was admitted to the Union as the forty-fourth state. That same year, in a church on the outskirts of St. Louis, the Reverend Samuel Kruse asked twelve ladies to be the first members of the St. Lucas Ladies' Aid or Frauenverein. Dedicating themselves to supporting the purpose and activities of their church and assisting the pastor, by the end of the year, thirty ladies had joined the organization. More than a century later, the St. Lucas Women's Fellowship continues to be a vital force in promoting Jesus Christ's ministry in their community and, via their support of home and foreign missions, the world.

The longevity and impact of our Women's Fellowship group will be celebrated throughout the month of March, beginning with a recognition service on Sunday, March 1st. During the month, members will be wearing commemorative ribbons, and on March 18th, a *Through the Years* celebration luncheon, including a performance by the German Cultural Society's Men's Choir, Mannerchoir, will take place in the Social Hall at 11 AM. Tickets for non-members are \$14 and will be on sale in the Welcome Center.

Join the congregation in acknowledging the impact and importance of this St. Lucas institution by congratulating the ladies wearing the ribbons and consider attending the March 18th celebration.
