

Celebrating the History & Missions of St. Lucas UCC by Joy Dressel

In the January Visitor, you read about the various health and human service organizations in and near St. Louis that were established by our denomination. For many of its 140 years, St. Lucas has also been connected through our denomination to a mission church and church camps that are a little farther away from St. Louis.

In the early 1920's, Rev. Paul A. Wobus, a son-in-law to St. Lucas' pastor Rev. Samuel Kruse, looked for a place to start a church mission project in the hardscrabble areas of the Ozarks. Wobus founded Shannondale Community Center in 1929 with goals of providing a church for the local residents, as well as, instruction on how to improve their lives with better farming and reforestation techniques. Today, Shannondale, near Echo Bluffs State Park, continues its work in the poorest county of Missouri. It includes a UCC church with weekly services, a place for community gatherings, a craft center for local artisans to sell their crafts, lodging space for retreats and work camps, occasional canoe and kayak camps, craft camps, a much-needed after-school program called "Timber Time", and a tree farm.

When the Evangelical and Reformed Church united with the Congregational Christian Church in 1957, we became connected to Camp Aurora, located farther west in the Ozarks. Some of our St. Lucas members fondly remember attending that camp as children. In 1962, Camp MoVal was established in Union, MO, by the Missouri Conference of the UCC, as another place to enable faith formation of children and adults in the outdoors. Today, Camp MoVal provides summer camp experiences for children completing kindergarten through high school. It also offers camps for families, young adults, grandparents with their grandchildren, and for people with special challenges. Many St. Lucas members have enjoyed attending summer camp and retreats at Camp MoVal. Others have been part of the staff, including Eric and Jorie Moeller, and Kit Norton.

The faith and lives of St. Lucas members and many others have been enriched by our associations with these parts of our wider church family over the years.

Letter from Pastor Bill

In her recent book, <u>How To Lead When You Don't Know Where You're Going</u>, Susan Beaumont, layperson and church consultant, explains that the word liminal is derived from the Latin *limen*, meaning a threshold, the bottom part of a door that must be crossed when entering a building. (p. 5). When a threshold is being crossed, a person is no longer outside of the doorway, but neither have they entered into the space on the other side. This moment of in-betweeness is called liminality; and the idea of liminality can be ascribed to individuals, or an organization, and even an institution – like a church. A church in a state of liminality is in a neutral space between an ending and a new beginning.

I believe that most American churches in 2020 exist in a state of liminality. They are on a threshold between approaches to ministry and mission and education and governance that used to work well in the past, but are no longer functioning as they once did. Yet, most churches don't know and can't see what is on the other side of the threshold. The Church that the Holy Spirit is calling into existence isn't quite ready to begin.

Uncertainty about God's future makes liminality a hard place for a congregation and its friends/ members to be. Most of us like the comfort and familiarity of knowing where we stand and what is going on. But being in a place of liminality is also exciting. God is doing something new with congregations and disciples, even though we aren't sure what God's new thing will be and we can't see it very clearly yet. God is still inviting us to be part of the newness, and promising to take care of us along the way and when we get there!

In interim time, a church pauses on the threshold from what has been in order to better prepare itself for what will be. I look forward to using this time well and wisely with you!

Introducing Our New Senior Interim Minister

The Rev. Dr. Bill Smutz, has been an ordained Presbyterian pastor for over thirty years. A native of Webster Groves, his academic background includes a B.A. in Economics & Business from Westminster College (Fulton, MO), a Masters of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary, and a Doctor of Ministry from Eden Theological Seminary. Bill has served churches in Ohio, Missouri, Wisconsin, Kansas, and Indiana. He served as the interim/transitional pastor at St. John's UCC, Chesterfield from September 2015 – November, 2017, and since December 2017 has been the interim/transitional pastor at First Congregational Church of St. Louis in Clayton. Bill and his wife, Gina, have three adult sons, and are over-the-moon grandparents of Taylor, George and Maggie!




February Prayer Shawl Ministry
